Warning: Website 'jonhboyl-solicitors.com' is operating and misusing the name of John Boyle Solicitors Limited

The website 'jonhboyl-solicitors.com' is operating and misusing the name of John Boyle Solicitors Limited.

What is the scam?

The SRA has been informed that a website at 'www.jonhboylsolicitors.com' is operating and misusing the name of a genuine firm of solicitors (see below).

The SRA understands that the website misuses the genuine firm's name, company number and address.

The email address provided is 'info@jonhboyl-solicitors.com'.

Any business or transaction through the website 'www.jonhboylsolicitors.com' or email address 'info@jonhboyl-solicitors.com' is not undertaken by a firm or individual authorised and regulated by the SRA.

Is there a genuine firm or person?

The SRA authorises and regulates a genuine firm of solicitors called John Boyle Solicitors Limited, and its address is 36 Fore Street, Redruth, TR15 2AE.

The firm's genuine website is www.jb-solicitors.com and they also have the website www.johnboylesolicitors.com, and emails from the firm use the domains '@johnboylesolicitors.com' and '@jb-solicitors.com'.

The genuine firm of John Boyle Solicitors Limited has confirmed it does not have any connection to the website referred to in the above alert.

What should I do?

When a firm's or individual's identity has been copied exactly (or cloned), due diligence is necessary. If you receive correspondence claiming to be from the above firm(s) or individual(s), or information of a similar nature to that described, you should conduct your own due diligence by checking the authenticity of the correspondence by contacting the law firm directly by reliable and established means. You can contact the SRA



to find out if individuals or firms are regulated and authorised by the SRA and verify an individual's or firm's practising details. Other verification methods, such as checking public records (e.g. telephone directories and company records) may be required in other circumstances.
