Applying for an early assessment of character and suitability

Updated 31 October 2025

If you are concerned about any potential suitability issues, you can apply for an early character and suitability assessment.

This means we will look at any issues covered by our <u>Assessment of Character and Suitability Rules [https://beta.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/assessment-character-suitability-rules/]</u>.

This is a voluntary application. You only need to disclose character and suitability issues at admission.

We are not bound, in any subsequent application for admission, by any decision made at this stage. If your circumstances are the same when you apply for admission, we will likely make our decision binding.

How to apply

You will need a mySRA account to apply for an early assessment. If you do not already have one, you can <u>create an account</u>
[https://beta.sra.org.uk/mysra/get-mysra-account/].

You must complete our <u>background screening checks</u> [https://beta.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/admission/screening/] before applying.

Once this is done, you will find the application in 'Start a new application' and 'Individual applications'. It is called 'Applying for an early assessment of character and suitability'.

Providing information with your application

You will need to upload evidence as part of your application. <u>Take a look at what evidence you will need [https://beta.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/character-and-suitability/disclosing-character-suitability-issue/]</u>.

If you do not give us the information needed within the time limits we set, your incomplete application will be closed.

What to expect after submitting your application



We will review your application and supporting evidence provided. We will contact you within 30 days to request any missing information.

When to expect a decision

We aim to decide within 120 days of receiving a completed application.

Fee

There is no fee for the application.

Refusal

If we are considering the refusal of your application, you will be given an opportunity to respond to any draft decision or report before a decision is made.

If your application is refused, you will have 28 days to apply for a review of the decision.

Following a refusal of an application, you may only make another one where there has been a material change in your circumstances relevant to your application.
